## REPORT OF COMMON ACADEMIC INDICATORS AT THE REGENT UNIVERSITIES

**Action Requested:** Receive the report of the common academic indicators identified by the Regent universities.

**Executive Summary:** Following approval of the university strategic plans and performance indicators, the Board requested that the provosts identify the indicators that were common to the three universities. The common indicators and their corresponding data points approved by the Council of Provosts are presented below and on the following pages. These indicators will be used by the Regent universities to monitor key academic measures.

The data points include the range for each institution's peer group and the peer median. Some data points reflect a demographic environment that is considerably different from Iowa's, e.g., there is a much larger racial/ethnic minority population in certain parts of the country, such as California and Texas, which can affect student demographics (enrollment). Other data points, such as annual royalties and license fee income, are available only at a system level, not for an individual institution, and are, therefore, not included.

### **Common Academic Indicators:**

- ◆ Racial/ethnic minority student enrollment by residence as a percentage of resident, non-resident<sup>1</sup>, and total enrollment<sup>1</sup> (fall data).
- ◆ Racial/ethnic minority tenured/tenure-track faculty as a percentage of total tenured/tenure-track faculty (fall data).
- ◆ Women tenured/tenure-track faculty as a percentage of total tenured/tenure-track faculty (fall data).
- ◆ One-year retention rate of new, direct-from-high-school freshmen (fall data).
- ◆ Six-year graduation rate of new, direct-from-high-school freshmen (fall data).
- ◆ Total sponsored funding by fiscal year, in millions of dollars (fiscal year data).
- ◆ Faculty salaries as compared to peer institutions (fall data).
- ◆ Three-year rolling average of annual royalties/license fee income (fiscal year data).
- ◆ Average financial need by expected family contribution as a proportion of financial aid accepted by full-time, resident, dependent undergraduate FAFSA filers receiving financial aid (fall data)
