IOWA PUBLIC RADIO ANNUAL BOARD OF DIRECTORS APPOINTMENT

Action Requested: Approve Iowa Public Radio Board of Directors appointments.

Executive Summary. Currently, Iowa Public Radio has 10 board members. In the IPR Strategic Plan presented to the Board of Regents in 2014, IPR recommended adding up to four more community members in recognition of the growing need for private financial support for the network. IPR recently changed its by-laws to allow for four additional community members. As stated in the IPR by-laws, community members serve three-year terms. University members will retain the voting power outlined in the IPR by-laws — a unanimous vote of the university licensee representatives can approve or disapprove measures before the IPR Board.

In October 2015 (Agenda Item 4f), IPR requested the addition of three new IPR board members (Robert Downer, Zachary Mannheimer, and Marsha Ternus) and extending the terms for Douglas West and Steve Firman from one year to three years.

Due to the recent resignation of the University of Iowa's representative, Lin Larsen, Jeneane Beck has been proposed to serve as the University of Iowa representative.
