**STATUS REPORT ON UNIVERSITY OF IOWA
APPROVED FLOOD-RELATED CAPITAL PROJECTS**

Action Requested: Receive the report on University of Iowa actions undertaken pursuant to the Flood Recovery Authorizations approved by the Board of Regents at its July 2, 2008 meeting.

Executive Summary: At its special meeting held on July 2, 2008, the Board of Regents granted the University of Iowa temporary emergency-based authorizations and waivers to several Regent capital processes to allow the University to deliver critically needed flood recovery projects in an expedited time frame.

The University has provided the attached report detailing its actions on flood recovery projects; the list includes new projects added in December 2008, as well as projects included on the October 2008 and September 2008 reports.
