# Budgetary Influences

2

- Flood of 2008
- Economic downturn
- ARRA stimulus funding
- Need to maintain affordability and quality in education

# 2011-2012 Tuition and Fees Proposal

3

- Resident undergraduate increase of 4.7 percent.
  - 5 percent tuition increase.
  - 3.1 percent fee increase tied to the cost of doing business.
- Tuition increment yields \$348 per student.
- Increment directly addresses strategic objectives in student success.
  - Builds on present year increases in applications, enrollment, and retention.
  - Enhances the first-year experience.
  - Creates a more student-centered experience.

- High-impact activities and career counseling


