SALE AND AWARD OF
\$27,450,000 DORMITORY REVENUE BONDS, SERIES S.U.I. 2014

Action Requested: Consider adopting the following resolution, subject to receipt of acceptable bids:

A Resolution providing for the sale and authorizing and providing for the issuance and securing the payment of \$27,450,000 (estimated) Dormitory Revenue Bonds, Series S.U.I. 2014, for the purpose of paying a portion of the costs of constructing and equipping a new residence hall for student housing and related facilities, funding a debt service reserve fund, and paying costs of issuance.

(ROLL CALL VOTE)

Executive Summary: The Board is asked to consider adoption of a resolution providing for the sale and issuance of Dormitory Revenue Bonds for the University of Iowa. Proceeds from the sale of the bonds would be used to complete funding for the **West Campus Residence Hall – Construct New Facility** project, which will provide housing for 501 residents. This bond issue is the second of two series of bonds which would be sold for the project; the first bond issue was sold in August 2012. At its March 2012 meeting, the Board approved the schematic design, and project description and budget (\$53,444,501) for the project. The University's Residence System is a self-supporting operation and receives no state appropriations.

The amount of the bond issue will be sized to provide project proceeds, in addition to the proceeds from the first sale, so that the net proceeds from the two sales do not exceed the Board approved budget. Principal on the bonds would be repaid over a period of 20 years, with annual debt service payments of approximately \$1.93 million. Payments would be made from the net rents, profits and income of the Residence System. Interest on the bonds would be exempt from federal and state taxes (double tax-exempt) for Iowa residents who purchase the bonds.

Additional Information: Under the provisions of Iowa Code §§262.55 to 262.66, the Board is authorized to construct, equip, improve, repair, remodel, operate and maintain residence halls and dormitories, including dining and other incidental facilities, at the universities. The Board is further authorized to borrow money to finance the construction or improvements and to refund such indebtedness.

The bond issue of \$27,450,000 and an anticipated reoffering premium are expected to include:

- project costs (estimated at \$25,804,652);
- debt service reserve (estimated at \$1,930,148);
- underwriters discount (estimated at \$411,750); and
- issuance costs (estimated at \$127,459).

The receipt and opening of bids is scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, February 6, 2014, and the award is scheduled for later that day.

Specifics of the bonds are:

- Average Maturity: 11.763 Years
- Bonds Dated: February 1, 2014
- Interest Due: July 1, 2014, and each January 1 and July 1 to maturity
- Interest Exemption: Exempt from federal and state taxes for individual purchasers who are residents of Iowa
- Principal Due: July 1, 2015 – 2034
- Optional Call: Bonds maturing on or after July 1, 2024 are callable commencing July 1, 2023 and any date thereafter at par
- Denomination: \$5,000 and integral multiples thereof
