PROPOSED 2026-2027 TUITION AND MANDATORY FEES

Action Requested: Consider the proposed tuition and mandatory fee rates for the 2026-2027 academic year as outlined in this memorandum, effective beginning with the Fall 2026 session.

Final action on the proposed rates is scheduled for the April 2026 Board meeting.

Executive Summary: Consistent with the Board’s strategic plan, determining and fulfilling appropriate resource needs are essential in providing high-quality public education, cutting-edge research, and needed public services. Predictability, transparency and long-term planning strategies are woven throughout the plan.

The Board considers the total resources necessary to maintain and strengthen the Regent universities. Regent institutions need adequate support from all sources, while promoting the effective use of resources to meet institutional missions and to maintain the quality of education Iowans expect. The Board considers the two main resources supporting Regent higher education – tuition and state appropriations – as well as the reallocations/efficiencies necessary to strengthen Iowa’s public universities.

While considering state support, operating costs that may be absorbed through efficiencies and reallocations, and the expected inflationary impact to higher education budgets, the proposed tuition rates in this memorandum for the 2026-27 academic year includes base undergraduate resident increases of 3.0% for each university (\$287 at SUI; \$286 at ISU; \$262 at UNI). The universities also propose varying tuition rates for nonresident, graduate and professional students as well as differential rates for certain higher cost programs.

Undergraduate Tuition and Mandatory Fees

The proposed 2026-27 base tuition and mandatory fee rates for undergraduate resident and nonresident students are provided below. A complete list of each mandatory fee is provided on page 4.

Funding from the proposed tuition increases will help address growing financial challenges including inflationary cost increases, uncertainty surrounding other primary revenue sources, recruiting and retaining faculty and staff in national markets, health care, meeting collective bargaining terms, deferred maintenance needs in academic facilities, and student financial aid to provide higher education opportunities to more students.

In addition to the base undergraduate resident and nonresident tuition rate proposals, the universities assess differential tuition rates for specific higher cost programs. Assessing tuition in this manner aligns costs where they are incurred rather than spreading them over the entire student population. Complete listings of the proposed tuition and fee rates are provided on pages 9-12.

Variances from the proposed base rate percentage increases for certain undergraduate programs for SUI are provided below.

State University of Iowa

- Since 2012, the Tippie College of Business (Tippie) has applied a differential tuition rate for BBA students based on their academic classification: lower level (0 to 59 cumulative credit hours) and upper level (60 or more cumulative credit hours). Over time, Iowa resident students have earned an increasing amount of college credit in high school prior to their matriculation to the University. As a result, many Iowa residents are assessed the upper-level tuition rate while in their first or second year at the University. Tippie proposes eliminating the classification-based differential and implementing a universal tuition rate of \$13,052 for resident business students and \$35,328 for nonresidents. The proposed tuition rates are higher than current lower division rates (\$11,514 for residents) and less than current upper division rates (\$13,522 for residents).

Eliminating the classification-based difference in the tuition supplement means some students in the lower division will experience an outsized effect. The Tippie College commits to providing additional scholarship support for 2026-27 to students who matriculated to Iowa under the existing supplemental model.

- Tippie fully absorbed the undergraduate programs in economics in Fall 2025 from the College of Liberal Arts & Sciences (CLAS). These students now have access to the same services as all other business students, including the Frank Business Communications Center, Tippie's embedded counselor, and in-house career services. To pay for these additional services, Tippie proposes economics rates of \$11,852 resident students and \$34,128 for non-resident students. The proposed rates are higher than the CLAS tuition rates and less than the rates of Tippie business students and will only apply to students declaring an Economics major in Fall 2026 or after. Returning students will be assessed the proposed CLAS rate.
- The Bachelor of Science in Pharmacy Services (BSPS) degree program was approved by the Board of Regents at its November 2025 meeting. This College of Pharmacy program is scheduled to launch in Fall 2026 and proposes resident and non-resident tuition rates equivalent to the base undergraduate rate of a College of Liberal Arts student.

Graduate and Professional Tuition

Variances from the proposed base rate percentage increases for certain graduate programs for SUI and ISU are provided below.

State University of Iowa

- Carver College of Medicine (CCOM):
 - The CCOM proposes a 1.9% increase in nonresident tuition rates for MD students. This proposed increase is an equivalent dollar amount to the proposed 3% increase for resident MD students.
 - The Master of Science in Athletic Training program proposes a 2.4% tuition rate increase for both resident and nonresident students.
 - The Doctor of Physical Therapy proposes no increase in tuition for nonresident students. This will allow SUI’s physical therapy program to remain vibrant as other schools are unable to fill their class sizes.
 - The Master of Clinical Nutrition program proposes no increase for non-resident students to allow the program to become more competitive.
- College of Dentistry
 - Advanced Standing Program - The College of Dentistry proposes a 1.9% tuition increase for current students in the advanced standing program and a 2.8% increase for any new students. There is no projected incremental revenue from these rate proposals given the concurrent changes in resident/nonresident class ratio from 70/30 to 80/20 as required by recent legislation.
 - DDS Program – The College of Dentistry proposed a 2.1% tuition increase to non-residents already enrolled in the program. For students starting in the fall 2026 or after, the College proposes a 4.5% increase for resident students and the same dollar amount for nonresidents (3.1%). As is the case with the advanced standing program, there is no projected incremental revenue given the concurrent changes in the resident/nonresident class ratio requirements.
- College of Public Health
 - Master of Public Health: The College of Public Health proposes no increase for resident and nonresident students due to the competitive nature of the field and new regulations concerning annual limits on federal loans.

Iowa State University

- Veterinary Medicine - ISU proposes a 4.0% increase to veterinary medicine resident and nonresident students enrolled in the highly ranked program. Veterinary education is an intense mix of classroom instruction and clinical learning in both teaching laboratories and a modern referral teaching hospital. The additional revenue will enable ISU to deliver state-of-the art learning experiences for veterinary students, and a positive working environment for faculty and staff; to maintain and upgrade diagnostic equipment, imaging equipment and medical supplies, while incorporating new technological advances; and to support faculty as leaders in veterinary curriculum development and teaching.

Inflation

The Higher Education Price Index (HEPI), designed specifically for use by higher education institutions and published annually on a fiscal year basis, rose 3.6% in FY 2025 according to the report released by the Commonfund Institute in December 2025.

Board policy limits the annual increase to the base undergraduate resident tuition to an amount that does not exceed the average of the three most recently established HEPI fiscal year inflation indexes. The proposed 3.0% increase to the base undergraduate resident rate is below the three-year HEPI average of 3.67%.

The proposed rates at all three universities combined are projected to generate \$38 million in incremental gross tuition revenue for FY 2027, approximately 2.1% of the current total general education fund operating budget.

Mandatory Fees

Mandatory fees, charged to each student, provide a distinct resource to respond to specific needs of students. Provided below are the proposed 2026-27 mandatory fees for each university.

State University of Iowa

SUI proposes an overall increase in mandatory student fees of \$62.

- Technology – As shown on the previous page, the University recommends a 3% increase (\$19 to the standard rate) in Technology Fees. The revenue generated from these increases will fund inflationary increases in IT expenditures that support students.
- Health – The proposed \$8 increase to the health fee will maintain the operations of Student Health and Student Wellness and support higher costs for medical supplies, pharmaceuticals and personnel.
- Mental Health – The leaderships of the Undergraduate Student Government and Graduate and Professional Student Government have endorsed a plan to increase the mental health fee by \$5 per year for each of the next three years (FY 2027-FY 2029) to add one new position to university counseling services each year.
- Student Activities – The Student Fee Committee, comprised of five students and five university employees, recommends a \$2 increase to the student activity fee to support operational cost increases funded by the fee and enhance program funding of student organizations.
- Student Services – A \$4 increase is requested to the student services fee to support Campus operations and bus fleet renewal.
- Building Fee – The University requests a \$12 increase to the building fee to continue modernizing student spaces and to address/eliminate a major portion of the significant deferred maintenance needs in the main library.
- Recreation - A \$12 increase is proposed to offset increased operational and programming costs for recreation services and anticipated capital repair expenditures.

Iowa State University

ISU proposes an overall increase in mandatory student fees of \$24.50.

- Technology - High quality, reliable and accessible technology is fundamental to all components of ISU's mission. Information Technology Services (ITS) enhances the student experience, protects student privacy, and supports digital accessibility by way of modern and useful technology and software. ITS is requesting an annual student technology fee increase of \$10 per student to support the increase in student-related software license costs, campus Wi-fi, and classroom technology.
- Building – The Memorial Union serves as a hub for student life and activities. The requested \$3.10 increase will help stabilize Memorial Union's budget and keep up with inflationary measures which directly impact their ability to reinvest in infrastructure.
- Recreation Services - Recreation Services at ISU is 94% funded by student fees. An \$11.40 increase to this fee is requested with increased costs of goods, equipment, services, and personnel. The requested increase will allow recreation services to continue offering programs and services that students enjoy as well as reinvesting in equipment and facilities.

University of Northern Iowa

UNI proposes an overall increase in mandatory student fees of \$42.

- Technology – Continued investment in technology is necessary to replace aging infrastructure, modernize instructional and classroom technologies, meet accessibility expectations, and

protect student information. UNI proposes a \$10 increase to the technology fee to support these initiatives.

- Health – Demand for mental health and wellness services continues to rise, and the cost of clinical staffing, medical supplies, and operational needs has increased with inflation. An increase in the health fee is necessary to sustain access to high-quality, timely care for all students. An \$8 increase to the health fee is proposed to support Student Health Services.
- Health Facility – The proposed \$1 increase to the health facility fee will help address aging building systems and rising costs for critical maintenance, equipment replacement, and regulatory compliance make it increasingly difficult to sustain the facility at current fee levels.
- Student Activities – The student activities fee supports a wide range of programs and services that enrich the student experience, including student organizations, fine arts programming and events sponsored by the Campus Activities Board and student life. The proposed \$4 increase in this fee is necessary to keep pace with rising operational costs and strengthen these essential opportunities for students.
- Student Services – The student services fee provides partial support programming, activities and services for UNI athletics. The proposed \$8.50 increase ensures that athletics can continue providing meaningful student-athlete experiences, strengthening school pride, and enhancing campus life through competitive success and community engagement.
- Building – The building fee provides a revenue stream to support continuing facility maintenance and operation needs in the Maucker Union. As the primary student gathering space on campus, Maucker Union faces ongoing increases in operational, as well as inflation raising prices of essential services, equipment, and materials. The proposed \$7 increase to the Building Fee is necessary to keep Maucker Union operating safely, efficiently, and in a way that continues meeting the needs of the UNI community.
- Recreation Services - As Recreation Services’ operational and programming costs continue to rise, the proposed \$3.50 increase in the recreation fee is necessary to maintain the quality of existing offerings — including aquatics, certifications and training, group fitness, intramurals, outdoor recreation, personal training, sport clubs and youth programs.

Estimated Cost of Attendance

Iowa Code §262.9(19) requires the Board to publish the estimated total cost of attending the Regent universities, including room and board and other costs, at the same time it publishes final tuition and mandatory fees.

Based on the proposed base tuition rates, room and board rates, and other costs, the following table estimates the total cost of attendance for a resident undergraduate student.

Other costs, as quantified for financial aid calculations, include the universities' estimates of student costs for books, supplies, transportation and personal expenses.
