#### **Recommended Action:**

Approve the University of Iowa's proposed course changes.

## **Executive Summary:**

The University of Iowa has submitted proposed course changes for approval by the Board of Regents. The University's proposal consists of changes made in course offerings since the Spring of 2003. The proposed course changes represent the continuing response of the University to the changing educational needs of students, changing disciplinary emphases, and the academic vitality of faculty.

#### Background:

Course changes occur each year

Net decrease of 27 courses

Some decreases a result of budgetary constraints

Each year the University of Iowa submits a request to the Board to approve course changes, including the addition and elimination of courses, and changes in department numbers, course numbers, course titles, and semester hours. Since June 2003, the university has added 324 courses to the curriculum and eliminated 351, resulting in a net decrease in active courses of 27. The University reports that a portion of the decrease is attributable to budgetary constraints, particularly in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, but that the elimination of any given course always occurs for sound educational reasons.

The Interinstitutional Committee on Educational Coordination (ICEC) and the Board Office have reviewed the revisions and recommend approval of the proposed changes.

The university's Health Colleges increased their course offerings by a total of 27 courses. The university's other colleges decreased the number of courses by 54. A summary of trends in the addition and elimination of courses since 2001-2002 is provided below in Table 1. A summary of the current proposal for course changes by college is provided in Table 2.
