ANNUAL ACCREDITATION REPORT

Action Requested: Receive the Annual Accreditation Report

Executive Summary: In compliance with Board of Regents policy 3.9, the three universities submitted reports and findings from programmatic reaccreditations for the Annual Accreditation Report to the Board. Accreditation provides quality assurance from external experts in the areas of faculty, curriculum, administrative and student support. In many professions, licensing boards and employers require completion of an accredited program to ensure employees have the necessary skills. Each accreditor sets its own timeline for the accreditation cycle, including for follow-up after site visits, so there is wide variance in the visit dates, final actions from accreditors and renewal periods.

In addition, each university is accredited at the institution-level by the Higher Learning Commission (HLC). A summary of the purpose of HLC accreditation, the timeline for it, and the current schedule for comprehensive evaluation at each institution is found on page 2 of this report.

The table at the end of this report contains the outcomes of the most recent programmatic reviews at each institution. Included are the following programs:

Accreditation Actions and Status: All programs listed in the table at the end of the report received approval for accreditation. Initial, provisional and probationary accreditation are all accredited statuses, but they do carry additional obligations for those programs as noted. As is common, some accreditors requested interim progress reports. All requests for interim progress reports were completed or in-process at the time of this report. In addition, each program reviewed received commendation for various aspects of the program design, delivery or outcomes while other aspects may need improvement. This process of peer review is an important part of continuous improvement for academic programs.

Institution-Level Accreditation and the U.S. Department of Education: Iowa’s public universities have all been accredited by the Higher Learning Commission (formerly known as the North Central Association of Schools and Colleges) since 1913 (SUI and UNI) and 1916 (ISU). Accreditation is a mechanism for quality assurance that is seen as a benefit to the consumer (i.e. students) in providing confidence that an institution of higher education meets certain standards. It also serves as a mechanism for taxpayers to affirm aspects of the soundness of the public investment into institutions of higher education. Since the passage of the Higher Education Act of 1965, the U.S. Department of Education (USDOE) has also relied on accreditation as a signifier that taxpayer resources in the form of federal loans and grants (such as Pell Grants and subsidized loans), are going to students who attend reputable institutions. Without accreditation from an agency that is officially recognized by the USDOE, students at an institution are not eligible to receive these and other forms of federal financial aid support such as the GI Bill or other Department of Defense or Veterans Affairs programs. Additionally, access to other forms of student financial aid, research grants and federal contracts may be severely limited.

While the process for accreditation may have modest variations among the national accreditors, the standards and expectations are quite similar as they must meet a set of criteria from USDOE.

USDOE Requirements for Accreditor Standards:

- Student achievement
- Curricula
- Faculty
- Facilities, equipment and supplies
- Fiscal and administrative capacity
- Student support services
- Academic calendars, catalogs, publications, grading and advertising
- Student complaints
- Program length
- Degree or credential objectives
- Compliance with program responsibilities of Title IV of Higher Education Act
- Five-year limit on pre-accreditation status

In addition, all accreditors must re-evaluate institutions at regular intervals, monitor and collect periodic reports and annual enrollment and performance indicators. To meet those expectations, HLC processes rely on regular touchpoints to review key metrics, as well as a 10-year cycle that includes a more in-depth Assurance Review on year four, a Quality Initiative Project between years five and nine, and a comprehensive evaluation that includes a campus visit from a team of evaluators in year 10. The table below displays the schedule for each Iowa public university for the elements of the 10-year cycle. Additional reporting may be associated with certain institutional actions such as “substantive changes” or monitoring reports that were assigned by a review team.
