REQUEST TO TERMINATE THE MASTER OF FINE ARTS IN MUSIC AT THE UNIVERSITY OF IOWA

<u>Action Requested</u>: Approve the request by the University of Iowa to terminate the Master of Fine Arts (MFA) in Music in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.

Executive Summary: When the MFA in Music was created decades ago, it was the terminal degree in music performance nationally. Since then, the Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) degree has supplanted the MFA as the terminal degree in the field and has proliferated nationally. Furthermore, with just 12 additional semester hours on top of the MFA in Music requirements, students can earn a DMA, which is more highly valued on the job market. The MFA in Music is rare nationally, and there are currently no students seeking this degree at the University of Iowa. The Council of Provosts, Academic and Student Affairs Committee and the Board office staff reviewed the proposal and recommend approval.

Background:

- <u>Description of program</u>. The MFA in Music is offered in applied areas (e.g. brass, percussion, piano, strings, voice, and woodwinds). It requires 60 semester hours of course work, including 2 semester hours of an MFA thesis.
- Reason for proposed termination. The DMA is now the standard terminal degree in the field and the preferred credential by employers. Currently, no students are seeking the MFA in Music at the University of Iowa.
- <u>Five-year trend in enrollments and graduations</u>. Between 2011 and 2015, there was one student who completed an MFA in Music and no new enrollees.

- <u>Effect on current students</u>. There are no students enrolled in MFA in Music at this time, and applicants are all directed to the DMA program.
- Impact on resources. The proposed termination will have no effect on costs because faculty will continue to teach in the DMA program.
- Impact on workforce. No impact on the workforce is expected.
- Alternative programs. There are no other MFA in Music programs in the state. Nationally, Notre Dame de Namur University (CA) and University of California-Irvine offer this program.
 Bennnington College in Vermont offers an MFA in Voice. No peer institutions appear to offer the MFA in Music.
- Effective date of termination. Program termination is effective upon Board approval.
