

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
# Access to pregnancy and delivery care in lowa is challenging

Only 43% of Iowa counties have an obstetric facility




## Declining rates of delivering physicians and delivering OB-GYNs




# With fewer alternative options, more babies are being delivered at UIHC



## UIHC obstetric care is more regional than local




# Iowans rely on UIHC for prenatal and other OB/GYN care




# Increasing need for complex obstetric care statewide





### More need for Maternal-Fetal Medicine care




## Patients requiring an antepartum stay





## More babies require NICU care




# Anticipated changes in community health care will further challenge UIHC's capacity

## **Volume and Financial Highlights**

September FY24

#### **THROUGH September 2023**

#### **Key Volumes**

Discharges: + 2.2% vs budget | + 1.6% vs prior year
Patient Days: - 5.0% vs budget | - 2.6% vs prior year
Surgeries: + 3.1% vs budget | + 5.0% vs prior year
Clinic Visits: - 0.4% vs budget | + 5.8% vs prior year

#### **Acuity**

Case Mix Index: 2.37

### **Length of Stay Index**

• Adult: 0.97

Pediatrics: 0.99

#### **Gross Patient Revenue**

- -0.1% below budget year-to-date
  - Inpatient: -2.4% vs budget
  - Outpatient: +1.6% vs budget

#### **Accounts Receivable**

Days in Net AR – 44.3 days

#### **Salary Expenses**

2.7% below budget

#### **Non-Salary Expenses**

0.6% below budget

#### **Operating Margin**

- Actual 10.2% vs goal of 8.6%
- Actual -1.3% vs goal of -1.6% (Without Directed Payment)
