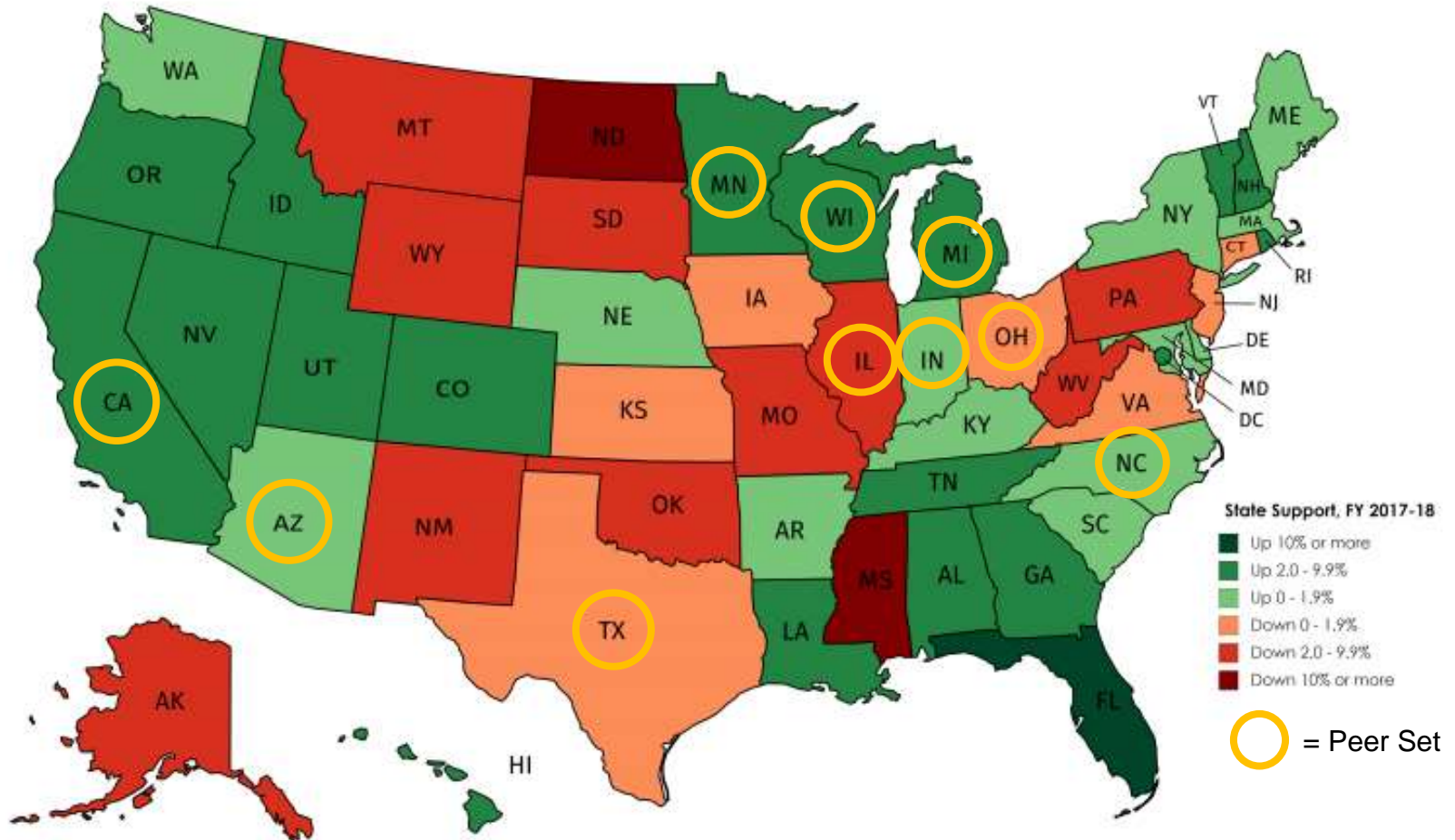

Higher Ed Funding FY 2018



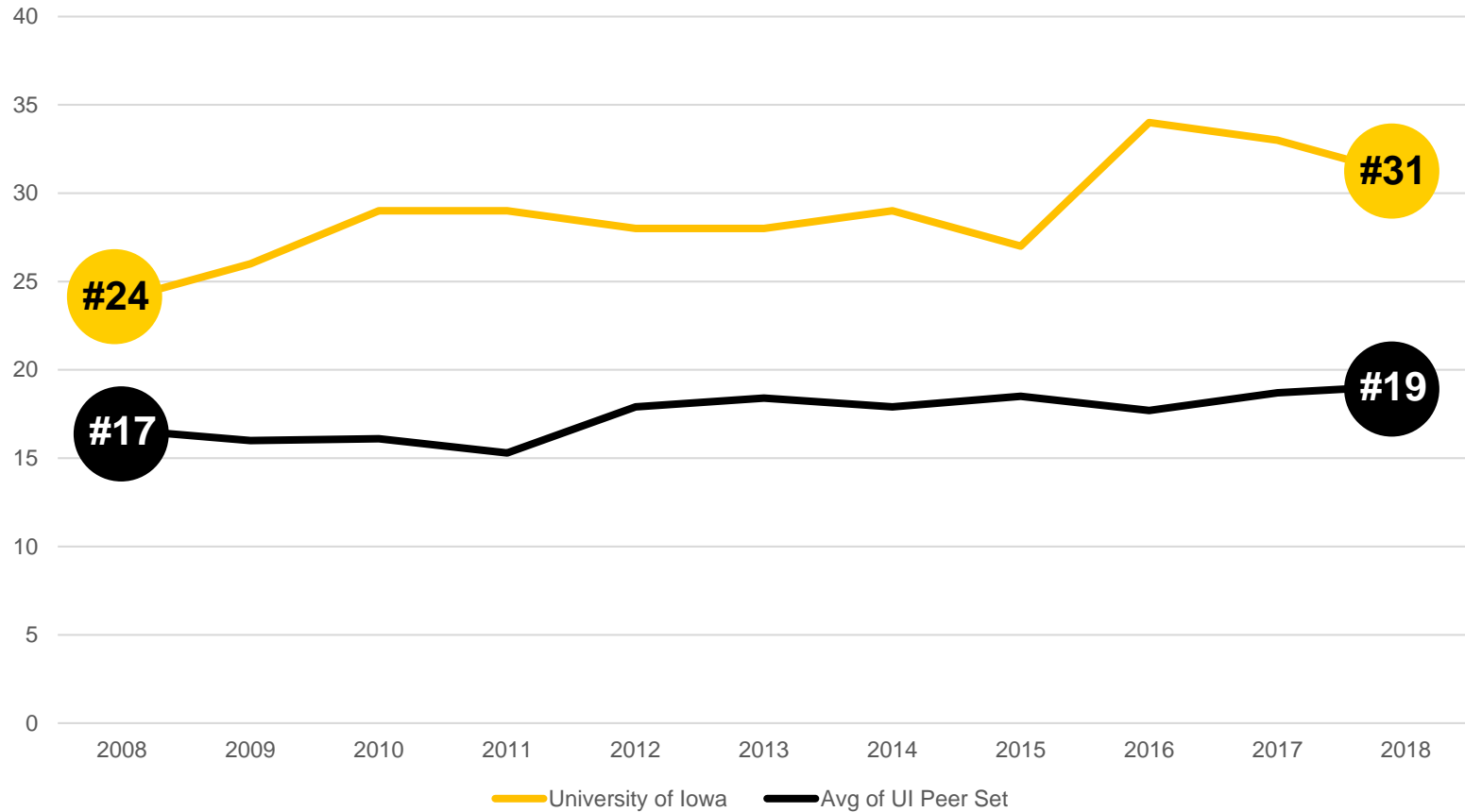
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FY 1998 vs. FY 2018

 - FY 1998 – \$4.36 B
 - FY 2018 – \$7.26 B
 - \$2.9 B 
- Consumer Price Index June '97–June'17  53%
- Support from the state for the University of Iowa
 - FY 1998 – \$223 million
 - FY 2018 – \$216 million
 - \$7 M

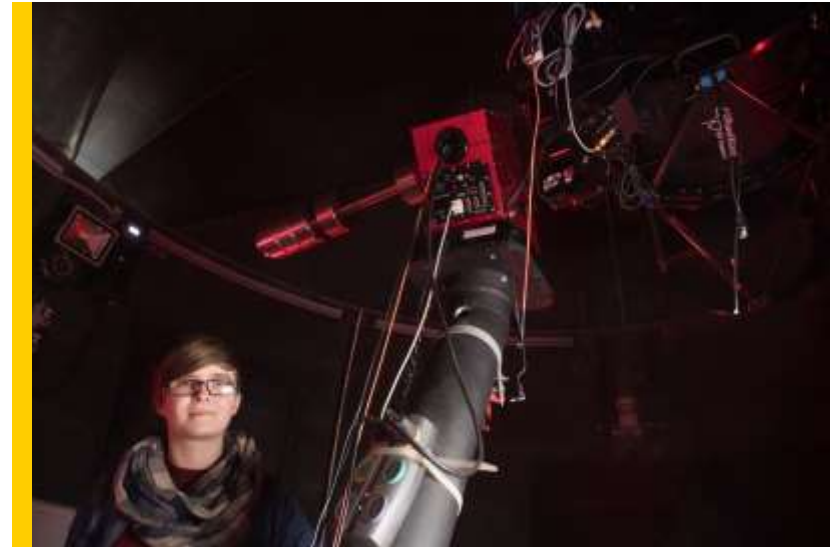

Investing in Faculty and Student Success

College of Liberal Arts and Sciences

- Two new faculty members and one newly tenured in Space Physics
- Investment of \$261K
- \$3.8M of new research funding
- 38 Undergraduate Research Projects in Physics and Astronomy



Investing in Faculty and Student Success

College of Law

- Two new clinical faculty members
- Experiential learning representing nonprofits across Iowa
- Experiential learning representing indigent defendants in federal district courts
- Only 2nd such program in the nation



Investing in Faculty and Student Success

Carver College of Medicine

- Seven new faculty members
- Investment of \$619K
- \$8.1M of new research funding from NIH

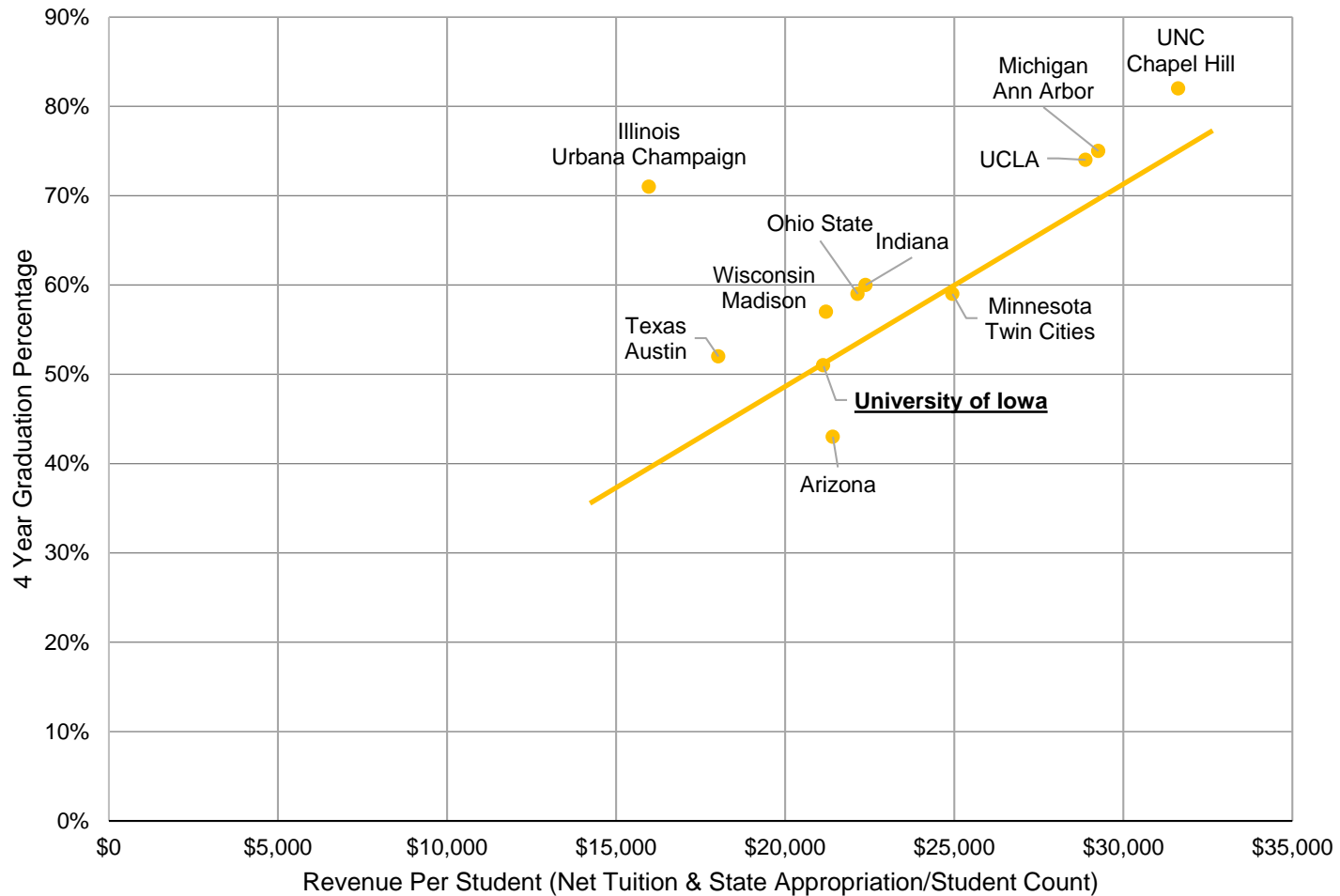

Investing in Faculty and Student Success

Targeted Support

Supplemental Instruction (SI) and Peer Led Undergraduate Study (PLUS)

- The UI is targeting additional resources to courses that have a high drop/ fail/ withdrawal rate and therefore negatively impact a student's ability to graduate in a timely manner
- The UI has seen a 6% increase in the retention rate of first-year students who accessed supplemental instruction compared to those who did not.
- The UI will invest additional resources in targeted programs that can have a significant impact upon the retention and graduation rates of our students



Investing in Faculty and Student Success

Student Employment

Iowa GROW

- Structured conversations between student employees and their supervisors to connect the skills and knowledge they are gaining in the classroom with their job
- Unique to the UI but growing interest nationally (over 150 institutions have inquired about the program)
- GROW students have a 9% higher retention rate than non GROW students



Predictable Resources = Better Student Outcomes

The Plan:

- ✓ Control overhead
- ✓ Ensure expenditures align with strategic plan
- ✓ Predictable/affordable five-year plan for tuition increases
- ✓ Invest in strategic plan to deliver on student success goals
