Subject: Final Approval of Miscellaneous Fees and Charges
Date: January 8, 2001

Recommended Action:

Approve miscellaneous fees and charges for the 2001-2002 academic year as shown on Attachments A and B.

Executive Summary:

The Regent Procedural Guide specifies that the Board has authority over all institutional or college-wide fees over \$1 per semester and all department fees over \$10 per semester. Review and approval of miscellaneous fees and charges is consistent with the Board's strategic plan to provide effective stewardship of institutional resources while advocating for resources needed to provide access to educational, research, and service opportunities. In December 2000, the Board gave preliminary consideration to the proposed miscellaneous fees and charges for the 2001-2002 academic year.

Miscellaneous fees and charges include both tuition-related (Attachment A) and non-tuition-related charges (Attachment B). Tuition-related fees include items such as continuing education courses and workshops. Non-tuition-related fees include a variety of items such as course delivery fees and private music lessons. In each category, students pay only the miscellaneous fees and charges that apply to them, with variances, in type and amount dependent on each student's program, needs, and interests.

At the December Board meeting, Board members requested that consideration be given to approval of miscellaneous fees and charges in connection with the Board's annual discussion of tuition and mandatory fees. The Board Office will work in consultation with the universities regarding this matter.

In order to increase fees or charges, the Board of Regents is required by law to take action no sooner than 30 days after notification of the proposed increase to presiding officers of each student government organization at each affected institution. The student government organizations received notice of the proposed increases prior to the December Board meeting.

The miscellaneous fees and charges are now being presented for final approval. Although two schedules have been presented for clarification of the two types of charges – tuition-related and non-tuition-related, none of the amounts as presented in December have been changed.

The universities proposed increases in the 2001-2002 academic year tuition-related miscellaneous fees and charges are comparable to the base tuition increase of 7.2% for the 2001-2002 academic year approved by the Board in October 2000. The universities also proposed various increases in non-tuition-related miscellaneous fees and charges. These increases are primarily attributed to the universities' cost increases.

Background:

Iowa Code §262.9(18) requires the Board to provide written notification to the presiding officers of the student government organizations at the affected institutions 30 days prior to any increase in tuition, fees, or charges at the Regent universities. This notification was provided as required.

Tuition, fees, and other charges are presented to the Board for approval at various times of the year as shown in the following table.

* Based on the final tuition and mandatory fee amounts approved in October, the Board authorizes the allocation of designated tuition and mandatory student activity fees in May.

Regent Procedural Guide §7.24A requires the Board to review and approve miscellaneous fees and charges. Prior to initiating new student fees or increasing existing fees, Board authorization is necessary for all institutional or college-wide fees over \$1 per semester and all department fees over \$10 per semester.

Miscellaneous fees and charges are identified as either tuition-related or non-tuition-related. Tuition-related fees include items such as continuing education courses and workshops. Non-tuition-related fees include a variety of items such as course delivery fees and private music lessons. The Board Office will continue to work with the institutions concerning presentation of miscellaneous fees and charges at the same time that tuition and mandatory fees are presented to the Board.

Analysis:

This section first presents tuition-related fees and then non-tuition-related fees proposed by each University.

TUITION-RELATED FEES

All three universities requested fee increases comparable to the approved Board tuition increase of 7.2% for the following miscellaneous fees and charges. The percentages vary slightly because the nearest even dollar is used after applying the percentage increase.

The **Applied Music Lesson** fee increases are requested to help cover inflationary increases. These fees have not been increased since 1995. The University is proposing increases in lesson fees for non-majors consistent with the fees assessed to music majors.

The University requested an increase in the **Course Delivery** fee for off-campus MBA instruction. This increase is the final increase in a three-year plan.

- This proposal raises delivery fees per credit hour from \$75 to \$91, a \$16 (21.3%) increase.
- This change is consistent with program cost analysis presented to the Board in December 1998 whereby program delivery fees would be increased a maximum of \$29 per credit hour for three years.
- Off-campus MBA instruction fees help cover distance education expenditures, which are not encountered with MBA on-campus programs.

Increases are requested for the **College of Dentistry** in the following areas:

- Instrument system management fees for the Class of 2002 of 5.6% are proposed to offset interdisciplinary costs associated with the operation of College of Dentistry instrumentation and central sterilization services and facilities.
- Laboratory supplies fees, proposed to increase 22.7%, from \$1,100 to \$1,350 for first year DDS students to cover rising costs. This is primarily the result of a new simulation clinic.

The **Orientation Services** fee increase is requested to cover program costs. This is the second year of a three-year plan to increase fees by \$15 per year to bring these services to a level of self-sufficiency.

The University eliminated the **Independent Study - Summer** fee of \$192 and **Duplication of File Materials/Registration Materials** of \$0.10 since they were no longer needed.

The University proposed a **simplified refund schedule**. This change would eliminate the “first term enrollees” category and treat all students the same. Effective Fall 2000, the universities are no longer required by federal law to have standardized refund schedules. Under new guidelines, institutions are free to determine their own refund policies, as long as they are in accordance with the revised federal regulations. Iowa State University and the University of Northern Iowa reported this change last year.

NEW/MODIFIED FEES

The University proposed three new fees and one fee with a change in definition for FY 2002, as follows:

The University proposed an **Early Registration - Masters of Physical Therapy** fee to provide an incentive for applicants, who are offered admission and accept it early, to confirm their commitment to enroll in the program. The advanced payment fee will be applied to tuition upon enrollment. Those applicants who are admitted but do not enroll in the program will forfeit the advanced payment. Those who are not admitted to the program and have remitted the advanced payment will receive a refund.

The early enrollment program will be beneficial to the University in the competition for high quality applicants.

The University proposed to charge an **International Students and Scholars** fee to all foreign students in any nonimmigrant status. Exceptions will be granted to participants in reciprocal exchange programs where the University of Iowa students are not required to pay such fees at the institutions they attend.

The proceeds will be used to improve the Office of International Students and Scholars' (OISS) services to international students; increase cross-cultural programming; and recruit more foreign undergraduate students to the University.

Currently, OISS spends the vast majority of its staff time on immigration compliance. With the addition of these fees, OISS will be able to devote staff to integrating foreign students into the University community as well as planning and developing cross-cultural activities.

A recent review of the administration of the **Doctoral Post Comprehensive registration** fee indicates that there is a growing practice of doctoral students registering under the post comprehensive status once they pass their comprehensive exams. This status is intended to allow continuous registration at a greatly reduced cost for students who completed their doctoral degree away from campus, not utilizing University facilities or resources.

The University proposed to reestablish this definition separate from Continuous Registration status for those students remaining on campus. Students remaining on campus would register for 0-2 semester hours credit and be assessed tuition at the prevailing graduate tuition rate. They would be allowed to enroll in one course each semester with the approval of their graduate program. If that course was more than 2 credits, they would be assessed the appropriate incremental amount above the 2 credits already being assessed.

IOWA STATE UNIVERSITY

FEE INCREASES / DECREASES

Iowa State University requested the following increases and decreases to existing non-tuition-related fees:

The proposed increase for the **Catalog Sales** fee is requested to be consistent with the University of Northern Iowa and closer to the fee charged at the University of Iowa. With the 2001-2003 catalog, Iowa State University will discontinue providing one free catalog for each continuing student. All new students will continue to get a free copy at orientation. Continuing students will be encouraged to use the catalog on the web, which will be available earlier than the paper catalog has been in the past. This fee covers the publication and administrative costs associated with printing and selling additional copies.

The **Course Delivery – Electrical Engineering** fee is being decreased from \$170 to \$153 to be consistent with the College of Engineering off campus programs. The additional tuition revenue allows for a reduction in this delivery fee.

The University proposed to eliminate the College of Design’s \$10 **Alumni Services** fee. The fee was used to cover the costs associated with printing and mailing information, which is now available on the web. The College has received no requests for printed materials in the last two years.

The University proposed to standardize the **Study Abroad Program** fee at \$300 for all programs which had ranged from \$200 to \$300. Revenue generated from this fee is used to support administrative costs, assist with student aid, and encourage greater participation.

The University proposed to increase the **Transcripts – First and Additional Copies** from \$5 to \$6 to cover development costs and on-going transaction costs associated with the development of a new web application. This application will provide a means for students and former students to order and pay for their transcripts.

NEW/COMBINED FEES

Iowa State University also proposed two new combined fees for FY 2002, as follows:

The University proposed to combine the **New Student Days** fee with the **Orientation/Matriculation** fee to create **New Student Programs/Matriculation** fee. The New Student Days fee has been voluntary since inception of the program in 1999. The New Student Day program will be provided to all new degree-seeking undergraduate students and the fee will be assessed accordingly.

The College of Education proposed to replace the **Annual Registration** fee with a **One-Time Credentials Set-Up** fee. The students will register and pay when they set up their credential file and are no longer required to pay annually for this service.

UNIVERSITY OF NORTHERN IOWA

FEE INCREASES

The University of Northern Iowa requested the following increases for existing non-tuition-related fees, as follows:

The **Instrument Rental** increase is requested to pay for repair costs on rented instruments. Currently, repair costs exceed rental revenue. This proposal should bring the costs and revenue into greater balance.

The proposed increase for the **Catalog Sales** fee is requested to be consistent with Iowa State University and closer to the fee charged at the University of Iowa. The revenue from this fee is used for postage costs associated with mailing free copies of the catalog to the K-12 school districts within the state.

The **Orientation Services** fee supports the summer orientation program. This program is not supported by general fund money. The increase requested would allow UNI to increase student wages for the student staff hired during the summer; pay supplementary wages for faculty and staff; improve summer orientation publications; and increase funding for Jump-Start, an orientation designed for minority students.

Price Laboratory School

The **Driver Education** fee increases are requested to cover increase costs associated with both the driving portion of the Driver Education Class (fuel, insurance, etc.) and the classroom portion (reproduction of materials).

The proposed increase in **Instrumental Instruction** would be utilized for increased costs associated with the duplication of music arrangements for students.

The proposed increase in the **General Fees for K-12** students is to cover the increased charges by outside contracted vendors for student insurance, testing fees, and textbook replacement costs.

The University also proposed two new fees and one new combined fee for FY 2002, as follows:

Career Services is planning to revamp their fee structure with a goal of providing a broader range of services while keeping costs stable. The **Cooperative Education Placement** fee is proposed as part of that revamping of fees. This new fee will facilitate the placement of students in cooperative education and internship experiences by offsetting costs associated with these placements such as:

- Developing and arranging placement sites;
- Assessing the appropriateness of the experience for college credit;
- Maintaining connections with academic departments that award the credit;
- Following up with placement sites for evaluation of student performance; and
- Maintaining databases of cooperative education/internship records.

The **Placement Services** combination of fees is also part of the revamping of fees at the Career Center. The University proposed to remove the general **Registration** and **Vacancy Lists** fees for all students. A vacancy list is no longer published and mailed since there is free access through the office web site. The University then plans to initiate a **Ten Additional Sets of Credentials** fee of \$30 for the establishment, maintenance and availability for application purposes of the credential file.


The University proposed to implement a new **Graduate Continuing Scholar** fee to provide access to computing, library, and other University resources for those graduate students not currently enrolled in courses but are working on a thesis, research paper, or dissertation.

CORRECTED FEE

The University inadvertently omitted a request for an increase in the **Alumni User** fee in the previous year's miscellaneous fees and charges schedule at \$35. Since the University has been charging \$45, they are requesting a retroactive approval to continue charging \$45.
