I have been disturbed by reports in the Chronicle of Higher Education about actions by Regent Pro-Tem Bruce Rastetter. To take just one instance, when the ethanol industry didn't like what a Univ. of Iowa professor said about the industry's impact on ground water, Mr. Rastetter asked the Univ. of Iowa president to intervene so industry officials could give the professor "factual information" and set him straight. A regent asking the president to instruct a professor to consider industry's "facts" more carefully? It's a blatant conflict of interest and attempt to intimidate a professor, for a regent first to represent industry interests, second to go to the top of the hierarchy, and third to assume that the professor has not done careful, balanced research.

No one is denying the ethanol industry a chance to be heard. Its representatives could have sent their information straight to the professor, as part of the data they'd like him to consider. For Mr. Rastetter to help them try to apply pressure from the top is an unethical abuse of his position.
